






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
nexBio Amazônia 2024

The nexBio Amazônia welcomes 7 Swiss and 7 Brazilian startups and 5 Swiss researchers for a two-week program in the state of Pará, Brazil, in July-August 2024. The program offers an opportunity to understand the market and experience a unique context, landscape, and culture to develop your project or product and expand your network.

The program provides connections with the Brazilian ecosystems, governmental and research institutions, innovation labs, mentors and experts from the sector, and meetings with potential customers and partners.

During the nexBio Amazônia, you will experience an immersive experience through the Brazilian bioeconomy ecosystem, focused on the state of Pará, to exchange with mentors, peers, and experts, hear from potential customers, learn about local culture and regulations, validate your market and research hypothesis in the Brazilian environment, and learn the possibilities to profit from revolutionizing sustainable supply chains of local high-value forest products.

The main objective is to initiate sustainable, short-term, easy, and quick-to-implement technological solutions that improve the sustainability and efficiency of existing production chains.




Important Information

What to bring?

- Documents: ID/Passport, Insurance Card, Vaccination certificate







Monday, 22 July - Welcome to Pará

The topic of the bioeconomy has been much discussed in the context of thinking about the development of the Amazon. One of the aims of this programme is to reconcile the different concepts of the bioeconomy and what each of them actually means for the people living in the Amazon region and for our Swiss participants. Throughout the programme, we will have different actors involved in our activities: the university, governments and industry. Thus, this first day will place us in a space of dialogue between Switzerland and Brazil, where we will be able to delve into different visions and see the contributions that startups and researchers have to present and contribute to the advancement of the bioeconomy.

Masterclass: Anthropology

(with Prof. Romero Ximenes Ponte at Sesc Ver-o-Peso)

Anthropologist and retired professor of the Faculty of Social Sciences of the Federal University of Pará, has extensive experience in the anthropological analysis of the historical-cultural-mythological constitution of the Amazon region. Prof. Ximenes also discusses the "myth of the Amazon" as one of the defining elements in the process of "inventing the New World," that is, the European presence in the Amazon region and its definition and conceptualization of its peoples and spaces. Prof. Ximenes will present the basics of the Europe-Amazon relationship and his perspective on the future and its challenges. In this way, we hope that we can start nexBio Amazônia with a clear perception of Amazonian culture, of the main local characteristics, in the hope that this will facilitate dialogue between the participants and allow the culture shock to be as beneficial as possible.

Recently named the place that most identifies Belém, Ver-o-Peso attracts thousands daily, including workers, consumers, and visitors. It is a huge open-air market made up of various elements, and the old market stands out with its four iron towers, a characteristic historical and architectural landmark of the place. Ver-O-Peso is an icon and synthesis of the city of Belém and the Amazon region and an excellent starting point for our journey through local biodiversity. We will see how the city, its products, and people are involved in this beautiful market.



Tuesday, 23 July - Success Stories Part 1


On the second day, we'll visit two of Pará's most traditional extractive crops: Cocoa and açaí. Did you know that Pará is Brazil's largest cocoa producer? And that this work is done mainly by riverine communities, family farmers and indigenous people, did you know it? In general, cocoa producers are families with low purchasing power and often close to the poverty line. The cocoa production chain currently generates 60,980 direct jobs and 243,920 indirect jobs and represents an important sector in the local economy. The state is responsible for an annual volume of 152,000 tons of cocoa beans. According to data from the Brazilian Institute of Geography and Statistics (IBGE), there are an estimated 30,000 cocoa-producing establishments, most of which are family-run. Of the total produced, 70% is sold to Bahia.




Campus Tour and Presentations (with Silvia Maia, Local Coordinator, Xingu Incubator)

In 2018, the Xingu Business Incubation Program was created, a pioneering initiative in the Xingu region that aims to meet local demands for specialized services in the creation and positioning of technology-based companies in the market, taking advantage of the potential of resources and biodiversity. The goal of this session is to learn from the use cases in the region and to connect with local entrepreneurs and researchers, who will be key contacts for potential future projects in this remarkable region.

Friday, 26 July - Imersion

Just when you think you have everything covered, you see something new. Altamira, the city and its challenges. Altamira, known for its violent past turned cocoa into its biggest tourist attraction economic power. The city is responsible for the production of around 6,000 tons of cocoa and uses this asset to turn cocoa into a huge tourist attraction, but not only. The quality of the cocoa produced in the Transamazônica has also won international awards. From 2019 to 2023, Medicilândia, Novo Repartimento, Placas, Uruará and other municipalities in the region won awards at high-profile festivals such as Paris. Altamira is becoming a pioneer in the north, and is also presenting itself as an articulating hub, since it includes neighboring municipalities, reinforcing the need to defend the brand not only for itself, but for the entire region that concentrates the largest cocoa production in the country. Altamira is the region's cocoa hub.



We will start the day by meeting the region's innovators at the "Centro de Inovação da Aces Tapajós" which is a project of the Commercial and Business Association of Santarém with the aim of promoting a culture of innovation in the Lower Amazon region, through an environment that offers structure and incentives for the innovation of products, services and processes, thus boosting regional competitiveness, economic growth and the generation of jobs and income. For the rest of the day we will discover the breathtaking flora and fauna of the region, experiencing biodiversity at its best. In the evening, we will be welcomed by a local indigenous tribe, which will present us with their culture in an interactive manner.



We will be presented with a number of relevant programs and organizations from the government, academia, and industry with operations in the field of conservation, biodiversity, and bioeconomy. PCT Guamá is an initiative of the Government of Pará in partnership with the Federal University of Pará (UFPA) and the Federal Rural University of Amazonia (UFRA). It is the first technology park to start operating in the North of Brazil, and its main objective is to stimulate applied research and innovative and sustainable entrepreneurship. Located on an area of 72 hectares between the Ufra and UFPA campuses, the PCT Guamá has more than 40 resident companies (physically installed in the park), more than 60 associates (linked to the park but not physically installed), 15 research and development laboratories for processes and products and the Dr. Celso Malcher Technical Teaching School of the State of Pará (Eetepa).







Friday, 02 August - Success Stories Part 2
